1.4 Overview

The rest of the Glossary contains definitions of terms used in documentation for BMWPHD. It is organized in a list of a term with its associated definition and then the next. The terms for each category are listed in alphabetical order.

2. Definitions

2.1 Horse Terms

2.1.1 *Dam*

Dam refers to the female parent of the horse. In other words it is the mother of the horse.

2.1.2 *Dam Sire*

Dam Sire refers to the male parent of the female parent of a horse. In other terms it is the father of the mother of the horse

2.1.3 *Foal Date*

Foul Date refers to the date that the horse was born, otherwise known as the horse's birthday

2.1.4 *Pedigree*

Pedigree refers to the horse's lineage i.e horse's family tree.

2.1.5 *Sire*

Sire refers to the male parent of the horse. In other words it is the father of the horse.

2.1.6 *Second Dam*

Second dam refers to the female parent of the female parent of the horse. In other terms it is the mother of the mother of a horse.

2.1.7 *Year*

Year refers to the year that the horse was born.

2.2 Earnings Terms

2.2.1 Horse LTE

Horse LTE stands for Lifetime Earnings won by the horse.

2.2.2 Money Won

Money won refers to the earnings of the horse in a show in a particular class or level.

2.2.3 PE

PE stands for Produce Earnings. It is the money won by the horse's offspring.

2.2.4 Rider LTE

Rider LTE stands for Lifetime Earnings won by the rider.

2.3 Show Terms

2.3.1 Back Number

Back number refers to the number used to identify the horse and links the horse to score cards for maneuver scores.

2.3.2 Class

A show is divided into multiple classes and a horse can participate in different classes. For example, a horse may enter 4 different classes at a given show.

2.3.3 Draw

Draw refers to the order that the horses go.

2.3.4 European Opt.

European Option (European Opt.) refers to whether or not the horse has a competition license for Europe, in other words did they pay for a European nomination?

2.3.5 Finalist

Finalist refers to whether or not a horse's score made them eligible for finals or not. This varies by class, but usually the top 30 make the finals in each level, if there are finals. Only certain events each year have finals.

2.3.6 Level

A level is a section within the class. Often there are different levels, or rankings, which are rider-based but limit which level the horse can win money in/place in that class, sometimes they can win money in multiple levels even though they only make one run.

2.3.7 Maneuver Scores

Maneuver scores will be 7 or 8 per class and received from 1 to 5 judges.

2.3.8 Nominator

Nominator refers to the person who enters the horse in the show.

2.3.9 Non Pro

Non pro refers to a non professional show, more like an amateur league.

2.3.10 On Dirt

This refers to the pause for a few minutes to drag the area every 5 to 8 horses so horses aren't running through the tracks of too many previous horses. So, a horse might be 1st on the dirt after a drag or 8th on the dirt.

2.3.11 *Open*

Open refers to a professional show.

2.3.12 *Score*

Score refers to the points the judges awarded to the horse in a particular event.

2.4 **Horse Attributes**

2.4.1 *Age*

Age refers to how old the horse is.

2.4.2 *Breeder*

Breeder refers to the person/group that bred the horse.

2.4.3 *Owner*

Owner refers to the person/group/organization that owns the horse.

2.4.4 *Rider*

Rider refers to the cowboy/person riding the horse.

2.5 **Developer Terms**

2.5.1 *Client (Frontend)*

The frontend or client refers to the Vue application that functions and the website.

2.5.2 *Codebase*

Refers to the repository containing both the server and client code on GitHub.

2.5.3 *Database*

The physical PostgreSQL database that is hosted on Heroku.

2.5.4 *Domain*

The domain name, specifically BMWPHD.net and its configuration.

2.5.5 *Email*

The dedicated email that is used to manage this project, dev@bmwphd.net.

2.5.6 *MVP*

Stands for minimum viable product, or the base

2.5.7 *Namecheap*

The domain name provider that contains domain configurations.

2.5.8 *Server (Backend)*

The Heroku server that hosts the website and the database.

2.5.9 *Spring*

Refers to the backend which uses the Spring Boot framework.

2.5.10 *Vite*

The framework used in conjunction with Vue JS for the frontend.

2.5.11 *Webmail*

The mailbox that hosts the developer email, <https://privateemail.com>.
